RockRide 2 Gibraltar to Bucks

Rockride2 is an Ultra Cycling Challenge for 18 cyclists to ride from the Rock of Gibraltar to Buckinghamshire, a distance of 1500 miles, in 14 days durng June 2014.

Rockride2, as the name implies, is the second time this challenge has taken place. The first Rockride took place in 2010 with 9 riders completing the ride and raising £75,000 for a number of charities.

Rockride2 is a much bigger event with the 18 riders raising funds for 10 charities.

As in the case of the first ride, the event is organised overall by Buckinghamshire Freemasons together with the assistance of non-masons. Such a ride requires a great deal of support for the riders en route and this is being provided by a team from E Coy 7th Rifles who have a fleet of motorcyclists and army chefs and medics to keep them well looked after.

Each rider is raising funds for one of the ten charities, so take a look at the rider's profiles to get information on them and the charities they are supporting.

THE LANDMARKS OF THE ORDER

(This is the 3rd portion of Paper no 2)

QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES.

No. 18 deals with the necessary fundamental qualifications of a candidate for Freemasonry-not any special or local qualifications which a private Lodge may see fit to impose-or rather, inflict (in some cases). So far as the landmark is concerned a candidate must be a man, free born, and of mature age. Regulations have been made upon this subject in order to explain the general principles created by the landmark.

No. 19. It is absolutely fundamental that a Freemason must believe in the Supreme Being-God, the G.A.O.T.U. Furthermore, it is also a condition precedent that a Freemason must believe in the life to come. (No. 20.) Such a belief permeates the whole of our ritual.

QUR GREAT LIGHTS.

I have already commented upon No. 21, but coupled with the V.of S.L. must be the other two Great Lights in Freemasonry-the square and compasses- and I therefore add them to this Landmark without fear of contradiction. There can be no doubt that they are the three Great Lights--and each one of them can rightfully claim to be enumerated as an unmistakable landmark.

Can you imagine anything Masonic-Whether a building, a Lodge, or literature of any kind, Without the distinguishing symbols of the square and oompasses being amply illustrated thereon. They comprise our Badge and reveal the glory of the Craft. Time will not allow me to dilate upon them and their symbolic teachings.

EQUALITY OH FREEMASONS.

No 22 -the equality of all Freemasons is a landmark which I fear is recognised by some in theory rather than in practice, but it is a fundamental principle which must be accepted and practised. Any brother Mason violating this landmark ipso facto becomes a spurious Freemason. Interwoven with this landmark is the grand principle of our Institution-brotherly love. A snob cannot be a real Freemason-it is impossible. The two states are paradoxical.

SECRECY.

No. 23. The secrets and secrecy of the Institution comprise another landmark Without question.

Thomas Carlyle wrote "Thought will not work, except in silence; neither will virtue work, except in secrecy."

The ancients regarded silence and secrecy as virtue. Mystery is the divine order of Nature. Unity and strength cannot be obtained except by secrecy. One Writer says "This common secrecy in Freemasonry makes for universal brotherhood, and creates a family feeling; and though centuries and oceans may divide Brethren, they do not weaken the bond, and neither time nor distance can break the chain."

Dr. Ashe in his manual says :-"Such is the importance of our secrecy, Were there no other ties upon our affections or consciences than merely the sense of the injury we should do to the poor and wretched by a transgression of this rule, We are

persuaded it would be sufficient to seal the lips of every man who proposes himself to be a Mason."
